SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan

In response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, small business owners in all U.S. states, Washington D.C., and territories are able to apply for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan advance of up to \$10,000. This advance is designed to provide economic relief to businesses that are currently experiencing a temporary loss of revenue. This loan advance will not have to be repaid. Recipients do not have to be approved for a loan in order to receive the advance, but the amount of the loan advance will be deducted from total loan eligibility.

As part of our coronavirus debt relief efforts, the SBA will pay 6 months of principal, interest, and any associated fees that borrowers owe for all current 7(a), 504, and Microloans in regular servicing status as well as new 7(a), 504, and Microloans disbursed prior to September 27, 2020. This relief is not available for Paycheck Protection Program loans or Economic Injury Disaster loans. Borrowers do not need to apply for this assistance.

SBA Express Bridge Loans

Express Bridge Loan Pilot Program allows small businesses who currently have a business relationship with an SBA Express Lender to access up to \$25,000 quickly. These loans can provide vital economic support to small businesses to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue they are experiencing and can be a term loans or used to bridge the gap while applying for a direct [SBA Economic Injury Disaster loan](#). If a small business has an urgent need for cash while waiting for decision and disbursement on an Economic Injury Disaster Loan, they may qualify for an **SBA Express Disaster Bridge Loan**.

C-19 RECOVERY LOAN – up to \$250,000 – for businesses in California, Arizona, Nevada, Washington DC, Detroit, Mi and Houston, TX

Who can apply?

Businesses in California, Arizona, Nevada, Washington DC, Detroit MI and Houston, TX; For-profit small businesses whose operations, revenue and staffing have been disrupted due to COVID-19; Businesses impacted by COVID-19 that need funding for working capital and inventory; Businesses that are fully or partially operational who are in compliance with state and local COVID-19 regulatory requirements.

The CARES Act included \$349 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). The PPP is a Small Business Administration (SBA) loan designed to help businesses keep their workforce employed during the Coronavirus crisis. Small businesses with 500 employees or less, as well as non-profits and sole

proprietors, are eligible to apply for up to \$10 million in forgivable loans at participating lending institutions.

Qualified small business employers must apply with the CDTFA for a credit reservation. The credit reservations will be allocated to qualified small business employers on a first-come, first-served basis. The reservation system will be available from December 1, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., through January 15, 2021. Within 30 days of receiving an application, CDTFA will notify each applicant via email whether a tentative credit reservation has been allocated to them and the amount of the tentative credit reservation.

This organization in partnership with Pacific Community Ventures and TMC Community Capital to provide grant funding to small businesses in LA County. Eligible business owners based on the criteria specified in the FAQs can apply for grant support. Applicants will submit complete applications and required documents. Those who meet the eligibility requirements will be entered into a pool of eligible applicants. On designated selection days, grant recipients will be randomly selected from this pool until all funds are expended. The size of the grant will be between \$5,000 and \$25,000 depending on the size of the business.

Grants vary in size depending on the size of the business. They have committed \$500,000 in grants through these two application windows: Round 1: now through Sunday, December 20, 2020. Round 2: Monday, January 11, 2021 to Sunday, January 17, 2021.

The Adolph and Esther Gottlieb Emergency Grant program is intended to provide interim financial assistance to qualified painters, printmakers, and sculptors whose needs are the result of an unforeseen, catastrophic incident, and who lack the resources to meet that situation. Each grant is given as one-time assistance for a specific emergency, examples of which are fire, flood, or emergency medical need. To be eligible for this program, an artist must be able to demonstrate a minimum involvement of ten years in a mature phase of his or her work. Artists must work in the disciplines of painting, sculpture or printmaking. Average grant size: \$5,000.

California Air Resources Board (CARB) Independent Contributor for the Heavy-Duty Vehicle Air Quality Loan Program

CalCAP supports loans made to small businesses to assist them in growing or maintaining their businesses. Loans in the Heavy-Duty Vehicle Air Quality Loan Program can be used to finance heavy-duty trucks (over 14,000 gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR)) equipped with engines certified to specified engine emission standards for 2010 and newer model year engines. The engines can use diesel fuel, compressed natural gas (CNG), liquefied natural gas (LNG) or other fuels, including zero emission technology. In addition, Equipment Warranty is eligible for enrollment when funded with the purchase of an eligible tractor.
